

## ANNUAL REPORT—2013

### GIVING

For thirty-one years, Episcopal Charities Foundation (ECF) has been the means for us to do what Jesus tells us to do. The generosity of people and parishes throughout the diocese, has provided the funds needed to meet this gospel mandate.

In 2013, ECF provided grants to forty-nine organizations and ministries which have provided food and water for the hungry and thirsty; housing for the homeless; clothing for the naked; healthcare for the sick; and visits to those in prison; just as Jesus asks.

Across the diocese, ECF funded food pantries, housing and homeless shelters, medical and dental clinics, transportation for children to visit incarcerated parents, and opportunities for young people to experience urban ministry. ECF funded gardens that harvested healthy food, and built communities.

ECF also funded after-school and summer programs for kids who need them; advocacy for those with no voice, church ministries for the challenged and the lost; and organizations which empower those in need of employment and hope. The Matthew Project completed a year of planning and in 2014 will oversee mission trips to Good Samaritan Health and Wellness center as Episcopalians across the diocese journey to Pickens County to help build the new center.

### CARING

A board made up of representatives from around the diocese meets several times a year to consider grant requests and to plan for the continued work of the Foundation. Board members make site visits for each grant request, creating direct relationships and contact with each ministry. This approach ensures that all funds shared are wisely utilized, and equally important, that the diocese deepens its understanding of the needs in the world it is called to serve, thus creating more faithful and effective responses.

### SHARING

The list of ministries supported by Episcopal Charities Foundation is impressive and the impact made by such a wide variety of programs is enormous. For the past thirty-one years, ECF has created dramatic and positive differences in the lives of thousands across the Diocese of Atlanta, but there is more to be done.

## The Matthew Project

In 2013 ECF broke with our traditional manner of grant funding to offer a unique signature grant. ECF initiated a three-year partnership with Good Samaritan Health and Wellness Center, Jasper, GA, to help build their new center. Over the next several years, the seven trailers cobbled together to provide health services to the medically underserved in Pickens County, will be replaced by new facilities. Groundbreaking took place in April 2013.

Funded by ECF, Volunteer Coordinator Hannah Phillips has been speaking to parish groups across the diocese about the mission trips to Good Sam to help build. She has enlisted volunteers who will serve important roles in the design and construction. ECF will provide funding to provide some of the tools necessary for many of the mission trips. We anticipate that each year we will see increased interest and participation, even extending to neighboring dioceses.



## Hunger Walk/Run

As a benefitting partner with the Atlanta Community Food Bank's annual Hunger Walk/Run, ECF saw increased participation in the event by parishes throughout the diocese. Responding to a challenge by Bishop Robert Wright to join in supporting the ACFB's event, ECF saw a 10% percent increase in funds raised, a 29% increase in the number of parishes participating, and a 25% increase in overall participation. Monies raised are used by ECF to provide grants to ministries in the Diocese of Atlanta who provide food and feeding opportunities to the hungry.
